COURSE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

1. INTRODUCTION

The salient pre-requisite for high quality research in social sciences is faculty members 'training and capacity building, who can disseminate their ideas to the research scholars for quality research in their respective fields. The philosophical basis of Social Science research is common to all social sciences, where different subjects have evolved their procedures through faculty members' training and capacity building/techniques of Analysis over time. Therefore, an interdisciplinary capacity building programme on research methodology is the need of the hour, as highlighted in the New Education Policy of 2020.

The Programme was non-conceptualized as an introductory module to resolve problems related to quality research and research writing. The Programme's salient goal was to facilitate discussions and practice that would enhance human capital formation related to research methodology.

(1.1) The Title of the Course

The course title was Ten- Days Interactive National Offline Workshop on Research Methodology in Social Sciences.

(1.2) Duration, Dates and Place

The course duration was 10 Days, from 01 to 10 December, 2020. The course was organized by department of Education and Commerce at Academic Block of Pandit Sundarlal Sharma Open University Bilaspur Chhattisgarh

(1.3) Purpose of the Course

(1.4) Focus of the Course

The Research Methodology Workshop attempted to blend social science, philosophy, theory and practical aspects pertaining to research. The workshop focused not only on the theoretical and philosophical dimensions as well as rationale upon which social research needs to be based but also varied practical aspects of research that a researcher encounters during various stages of conducting research from identification of problem till publication of report. The workshop offered the practical experiences to the participants on the use of a variety of qualitative, quantitative and mixed method design in their research works.

The course was designed with an interdisciplinary approach in a Special Lectures-cum-Workshop format enabling participants to discuss and debate relevant issues in social science research, critically evaluate recent trends and handle datasets, techniques and methods used in contemporary research in social sciences.

The workshop was conducted in both lecture and interactive mode. In addition to the interactive classroom lectures the participants were also be introduced how to use the free software's.

(2.4) Criteria of Selection

This Research Methodology Course has been received total 68 applications till the last date. After the extensive discussion and debates on the possible guidelines for the short listing of the participant to the course the committee has finalized the guideline. The following criteria/ guideline have been adopted by the selection committee while doing the selection of candidates to the programme:

✓ The committee have selected 30 participants (20 outstation participants and 10 local participants)

- ✓ Out of 20 external candidates, 10 candidates have been selected from neighboring cities of Bilaspur and 10 candidates have been selected from the neighboring states.
- ✓ The incomplete forms have not been considered for the short listing.
- ✓ Due to some reasons, if any outstation selected participants could not turn up to the course, the course director can take the more local participants to fulfill the number of participant's criteria.
- ✓ The committee also tries to maintain geographical diversity while making the selection of the candidates.

(2.5) Composition of Selection Committee

The selection committee for screening the registrations comprised the Co-Course director (Dr Beena Singh), another two selection Committee Members (Dr.Anita Singh and Dr. Pushkar Dubey). The screening committee screened all the registrations and selected participants keeping in view gender, subject, social category and nature of their residence and NOC submitted by their parent organization. Following the norms of ICSSR, 30 participants were selected for the course.

(3.4) Case Studies/Research papers discussed

Every lecture, were having some kind of case studies discussed by the resource person, the resource person from each discipline has discussed from their respective specialization. Case studies in anthropology, Case study in social research, case study in politics, case studies on management decision. The few resource person used their own research paper to show how to write it, check plagiarism in the research paper, and write a research proposal/project proposal. The resource person shared the case studies and research paper in the form of PowerPoint presentation, soft copy of the research paper, or sharing the material using ICT.

(3.5) Data Sources/Library sources discussed

Prof. Brijesh Tiwari, Professor and Head of Library & Information Science Department, Guru Ghasidas Central University discussed about the Need of literature review and research Gap, Identification & use of Library and e-resources. Other resource persons also discussed the use of primary and secondary sources in the social science research, how to construct a questionnaire, tools of data collection, data sources on Indian economy, use of e-resources in social science research etc.

(3.6) Analytical tools discussed

Dr Vinod Sen, Department of Economics, IGNTU, Amarkantak, M.P. delivered lecture on Methods of data collection & Uses of SPSS followed by hands on practice sessions.

During this Course on Research Methodology in Social Sciences, lectures were devoted for Use of Statistics in Social Science Research and use of e-resources.

(4.2) Detail note on field trip

Field Trip Visit Report

An Educational Field Trip was planned by the organizers on the 7th day of ICSSR Sponsored workshop entitled Research Methodology. The participants were taken for trip to Amarkantak, a small village situated in mountain range of Vindhya and Satpura hills famous for its Spiritual, Historical & Natural Beauty. It is famous for the origin point named Narmada Kund, Sonmuda & Jaleshwar Mahadev of three rivers Narmada, Son & Johila River. The participants enjoyed the beauty of nature by visiting waterfalls like-Kapil Dhara which is surrounded by lush green environment located just 6 km towards the north-west of the Narmada Kund temple. The water fall is named after sage Kapil Muni. Doodh Dhara Waterfall is formed by the holy Narmada River and is the 2nd waterfall on the river Narmada after Kapil Dhara Waterfall & Durga Dhara is a very small waterfall, but very beautiful. Durga Dhara waterfall was running even in the summer rainy & winter months. Participants enjoyed & attracted by the cold weather with the combination of spiritual & historical ascents like visit to Narmada temple, Mai ki bagiya, Kabir chabutra, Jain mandir & Kalyan Ashram. The Shree Yantra temple was the center for attraction for the participants. The most prominent feature of this temple is the huge sculpture with 4 heads at the entrance. The temple itself is built as a 3D projection of the Sri Yantra / Sri Chakra which forms the core of the Sri Vidya worship in Hinduism. It is the geometric representation of the concept of Shakti. The day ended with the natural discussion about the Saal & Saagon tree and the environmental conditions that remain temperate throughout the year and became the center of attraction for visitors throughout the year.

The feedback received depicts that the course successfully fulfilled its objectives. However, some participants have given some suggestions for improvement. The major suggestions given by participants are:

- (i) More practical sessions should be incorporated in the schedule to facilitate minute details of using quantitative data analysis software like SPSS and Python.
- (ii) The research writing section is excellent, and more lectures should be incorporated related to reference management software and software related to plagiarism testing.
- (iii) Practical exercise related to research proposal writing should be introduced to facilitate proposal writing among the faculty members.

(5.4) Observations/Recommendations of the Resource Person on the programme

Each resource person was asked to provide comments and suggestions during the programme to increase the effectiveness and administration of the capacity building programme. The resource persons provided the following feedback.

Dr Sambit Padhi emphasized that research should be conducted practically by university faculty members to advance knowledge. He argued that instructors should develop passion for study that will to become better teachers.

Prof. Sujeet Mishra, said social science researchers should participate in some form of action research at their parent institutions so that their work might aid in the practical growth of their organizations.

Prof. Vinod Sen advocated for more practical sessions related to designing Interview, schedules and its practical application in the field. He suggested to initiate action research as a co–curriculum computer-friendly interview schedules of the hour.

Dr S.Rupendra Rao emphasized the necessity to spread qualitative research in our nation since India is a society that is heterogeneous and where only survey research is unable to generalize the complex social reality. In addition to thanking the organizers for include discussion sessions on qualitative research methods, he encouraged the participants to conduct case studies, observations, and concentrated group discussions.

Prof. Rajeev Chowdhary, emphasized the value of the research methods programme and suggested holding it at least twice to increase faculty members' capacity for conducting research.

Dr Gauri Sharma, said that the program's framework is well-organized and in line with the methods used in quantitative research. She emphasized the use of scientific sampling to ensure that survey results were representative of all participants.

Prof Raksha Singh, thanked the program's organizers for include research paper writing in the curriculum. She has warned the participants about the prevalence of predatory individuals in Indian social science. She suggested holding two sessions of the paper clinic to go over the specifics of the editing and writing.

Dr Jay Singh further commended the organizer for including issues with plagiarism and the usage of electronic resources in the course material. He emphasized that using plagiarism detection software in research solely mechanically won't improve social science research in India. Instead, researchers should grasp the procedures of citation and reference in a scientific way.

6. COURSE DIRECTOR'S SUGGESTION

As a course director and Co-director, we are extremely pleased that we have successfully conducted 10 days workshop on Research methodology sponsored by ICSSR New Delhi. The curriculum of the course was worth taking and has imbibed unleashing potential to unlock among the attendees. The programme was beneficial to the research scholars and teachers in terms of learning and culturing new skills required for research we look ahead for such future prospects to collaborate with ICSSR New Delhi for such learning events.

We would like to offer some suggestions for the ICSSR, New Delhi, to take into consideration while keeping in mind the talks with participants.

- (I) The ICSSR should be as generous as possible in providing opportunities to the research institutes/universities of the periphery because faculty members at State Universities (particularly those in the Hindi-speaking region of central India) and government colleges have very little experience learning about research methods and writing research papers.
- (II) Pandit Sundarlal Sharma Open University is ready to organize at least two Capacity Building Programme in a year, keeping in view the enthusiasm from the participants.
- (III) The discussions about the research writing component of the programme left a big impression on the participants. The ICSSR should start short-term research writing workshops to introduce research scholars to the publication process, which is currently not covered in the ten-day and twelve-day courses it sponsors on research methodology.
- (IV) The ICSSR stipulates that a resource person may only provide two lectures; nevertheless, our experience shows that practical sessions including SPSS and the writing and editing of research papers frequently require more time. It is therefore recommended that ICSSR provide the organizers permission to set aside at least three talks for practical social science research issues.
